

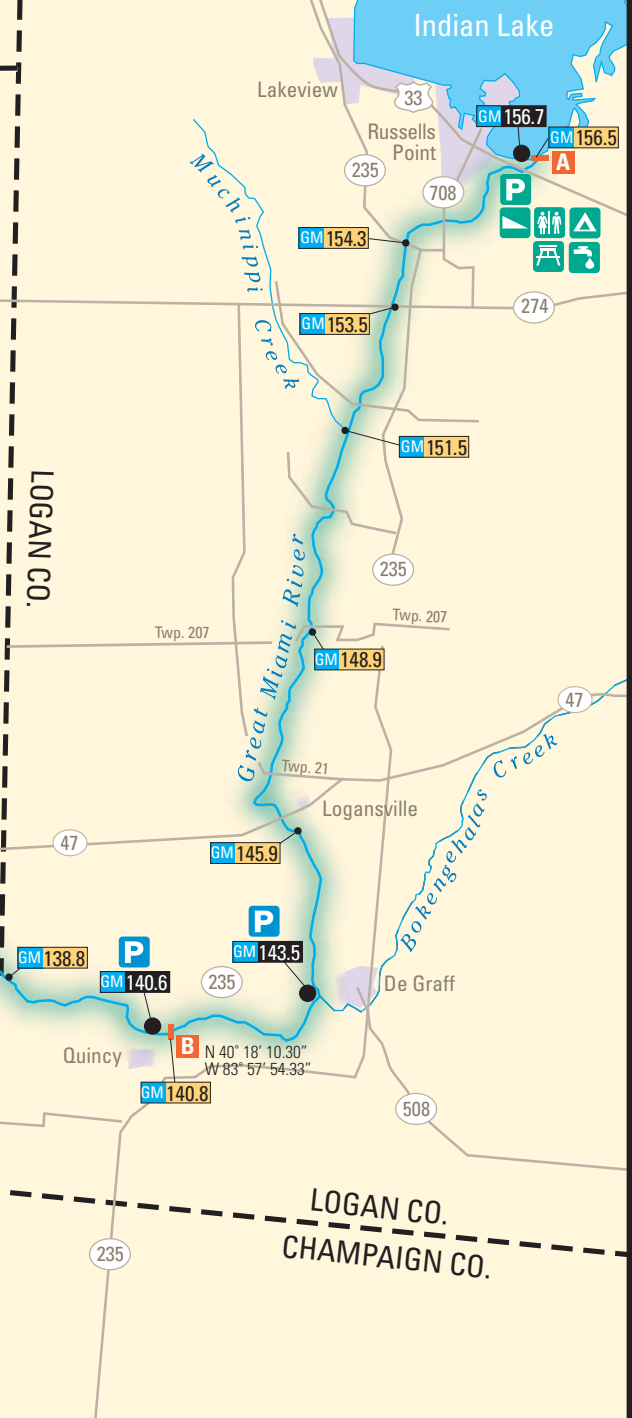
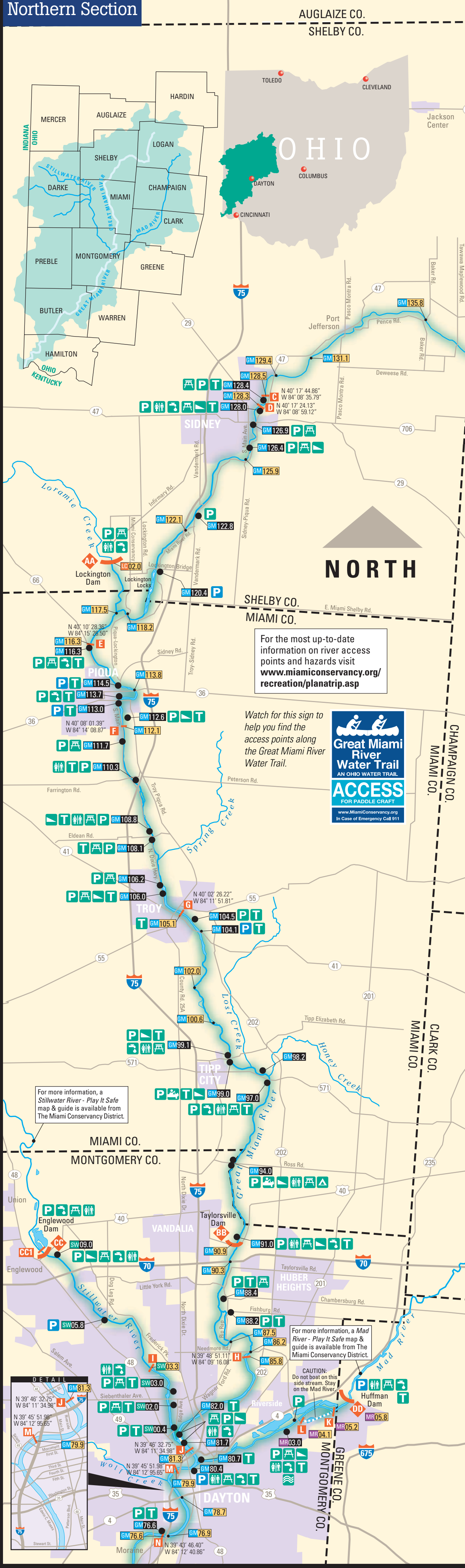
Great Miami River Water Trail
